Sunday of the Word of God: On the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time we celebrate 'Sunday of the Word of God' – a day instituted by Pope Francis in 2019 on the Feast of St Jerome, the man who translated most of the Bible into Latin, and who famously said, 'ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ'. By naming a specific Sunday to commemorate the 'unbreakable bond between the Sacred Scripture and the Eucharist', Pope Francis writes in his Apostolic Letter, 'Aperuit Illis', "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the Word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his Word and enable us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world. The theme chosen for this year is: 'Abide in my word (Jn. 8:31).' To read the Apostolic Letter in more detail search "Aperuit Illis". There is also a printed copy in the porch.

Sacramental Preparation: This Sunday at **9.45am** parents and children preparing for the First Holy Communion will take part in the fourth session of the sacramental preparation. The focus of the session will be how we can live our lives closer to Jesus by using the Beatitudes as our guide. May we remind the families preparing for the first Holy Communion that the participation in the Eucharistic celebration on Sundays is an essential part of a child's preparation for the First Holy Communion.
